2020-2021 Virtual School of Performing Arts:

- As live engagement opportunities begin to reopen, participation in virtual classes and performances dwindled.
- Virtual Classes Fall 2020: 62 participants
- Virtual Classes Spring 2021: 37 participants
- Virtual Classes Summer 2021: 13 participants

Outreach programs:

- Broadway Roulette Mixers Fall 2020: 4 sessions with 19 participants
- PYTeens
 - Anti-racist book club to guide teens through recent racial unrest
 - Youth Theatre Podcast: 30 participants, total audience 9323
- Theatre in the Park Summer 2021: 119 participants
 - Offered full-day and half-day camps in two-week sessions, small groups of 10
 - Programs included The Frog Prince, The Brothers Grimm, Death by Dental Floss, Alice and Wonderland, Peter Pan and others

Reflections on the past year:

- Lots of learning by staff and participants to develop alternative ways to present shows via live streaming, continuing this fall to school audiences
- Business processes (e.g. registration paperwork) moved online and will remain as such moving forward; well received by producers and staff
- After not being able to support seasonal staff in 2020, PYT hired 3 teaching artists in 2021 to support online classes and now has 4 seasonal teaching artists supporting studio and school classes this fall.

2021-2022 Season:

- All Together Now! return to MainStage performance November 13-14
 - o Interviewed cast members for press (attached) everyone is thrilled to be back!
- Stories on Stage
 - Our three fall performances are safely rehearsed and filmed in-studio and streamed online for school groups and general audiences
 - The Reluctant Dragon performed October 8-9: 145 school audience, 26 general (note: it is possible this number will grow, as many schools schedule performances after the initial run)
 - Later this fall: The Golden Goose (November 5-6) and The Elves and the Shoemaker (December 10-11)
 - Planning spring performances to return in-person to MVCPA SecondStage
 - Will hold another audition cycle in early 2022 to supplement spring SOS casting
- Decision-making in progress for 2022; planning full return to live audiences
