The Performing Arts Committee Sponsors the High School One-Act Play Festival. Applications to direct are released in the spring and directors are chosen in September. Mentors provide professional advice. Open Auditions are held in November when directors begin casting. High school students are also chosen for technical roles such as stage manager, lighting designer, sound designer. Performances take place the following February at SecondStage at the Mountain View Center for Performing Arts, 500 Castro Street, Mountain View, California.
