As requested, an arborist report of my findings on a tree located at 1553 Meadow Ln. has been compiled. The following information is site-specific and written for reporting purposes accordingly.



This tree is an Italian Stone Pine (**Pinus pinea**), located in the front of the property along the street. This tree stands approximately 35 feet in height and has a DBH of approximately 39 inches. This tree has a lean towards the street and a very poor form throughout the canopy of the tree. At about 12 feet up, there is a large lateral area that appears to be around 30 inches in diameter that extends out over the house and driveway. On the opposite side of the tree, there are multiple laterals that extend out towards the neighbors house over the yard; these laterals are around 15 to 20 inches in diameter. The canopy of this tree almost extends to the other side of the street and is full of dead and dying branches.

There appears to be significant damage to the walkway between the base of the tree and the street. This damage appears to be caused from the roots of the tree.if area was to be repaired this would consist of damaging up to around 30% of root zone.



Suggestions: This tree has significantly overgrown its area. I feel it is a hazard to not only the houses, but any vehicles and pedestrians within the area of the canopy. I feel this tree should be removed immediately and a new tree planted in a more suitable location on property no where tree could over hang public right away s or homes.

<u>Note:</u> There are two smaller pine trees located below the canopy of this tree that have very poor form and heavy leans that I feel should be removed at the same time.
