Item 6.1 – Parks and Recreation Commission Subcommittee for Community Tree Master Plan Update

1. What is the timeline for completing the Community Tree Master Plan five-year update?

The Community Tree Master Plan five-year update is expected to be completed by the end of the calendar year, with the final update presentation to the Parks and Recreation Commission in October 2022, and to City Council in November 2022.

2. In comparison with the most recent past version of the Mountain View Street Tree List, which species have been added to this current list? Which species have been removed?

The following species have been added to the revised list:

Blue Oak (Quercus douglasii)
Catalina Ironwood (Lyonothamnus floribundus)
Emerald Sunshine Elm (Ulmus propinqua)
European Hackberry (Celtis australis)
Little Gem Magnolia (Magnolia grandiflora)
Marina Madrone (Arbutus marina)
Water gum (Tristanopsis laurina)
Western Redbud (Cercis occidentalis)

The following species have been removed from the revised list:

American Elm (Ulmus americana)
American Hazelnut (Corylus americana)
Avocado (Persea americana)
Black Maple (Acer nigrum)
Black Walnut (Juglans nigra)
California Pepper (Schinus molle)
Camphor Tree (Cinnamomum camphora)
European Beach (Fagus sylvatica)
Kentucky Coffee Tree (Gymnocladus dioica)
Persimmon (Diospyros virginiana)
Pomegranate (Punica granatum)
Queensland Kauri (Agathis robusta)
Red Horse Chestnut (Aesculus x carnea)
Sawtooth Oak (Quercus acutissima)
Sour Gum (Nyssa sylvatica)
