The EPC deliberated on this item.

Motion - M / S - Capriles / Hehmeyer - That the Environmental Planning Commission:

- 1. Recommend the City Council approve the Initial Study of Environmental Significance for the 400 Logue Avenue residential project, pursuant to Section 15168 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and find the project within the scope of the East Whisman Precise Plan Final Environmental Impact Report (Exhibit 1 to the EPC Staff Report); and
- 2. Recommend the City Council adopt a Resolution approving a Planned Community Development Permit and Development Review Permit for a new eight-story, 408-unit residential development, a 36,000 square foot transfer of Development Rights, and a Heritage Tree Removal Permit to remove five heritage trees located at 400 Logue Avenue, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Exhibit 2 to the EPC Staff Report).

6. COMMISSION/STAFF ANNOUNCEMENTS, UPDATES, REQUESTS, AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

Commissioner Schmiesing is stepping down as a Commissioner.

Principal Planner Anderson canceled the June 2, 2021 EPC meeting; and there is a high probability that the June 16, 2021 EPC meeting will most likely be canceled.

Agenda items for the upcoming EPC Fall schedule include: Study Sessions for the Housing Element and North Bayshore Master Plan; Public Hearings for the North Bayshore Bonus FAR and Gateway Master Plan; TDR for the San Antonio Center project; and 555 Middlefield project

The Council Strategic Roadmap will be up for review and adoption on June 8, 2021.

Chair Cranston is concerned about the trend that is emerging regarding BMR and the economic impact the BMR ordinance is having on projects: i.e. SummerHill cancellation; Google. The trend is causing more consternation than what the Commission expected to hear.
