SUBJECT: Discussion on Public Art Content within the Economic Development Website

PURPOSE

Discuss website content related to visual arts, including public art located within the Economic Development website (econdev.mountainview.gov/public-art).

RECOMMENDATION

Provide direction to staff on content to include within the Economic Development website related to public art.

BACKGROUND




Figure 1: Screenshot of Public Art Page for City of Mountain View

The Economic Development website includes information about Public Art (Figure 1) within the City of Mountain View, including information about public art in the City generally, the drafted public art strategy, a public art map, and information on the Visual Arts Committee (VAC).

ANALYSIS

There are several subpages on Public Art, including:

1. [Public Art main page](#)—A brief outline of public art in Mountain View, the City of Mountain View's Two Percent for Public Art Program, and the Call for Artist process.
2. [Public Art Strategy](#)—An overview of the work done on the public art strategy, including drafted goals and strategy items.
3. [Public Art Map](#)—An interactive Google map of public art pieces installed within the City of Mountain View (updated March 2024).
4. [Visual Arts Committee](#)—Link to the City's main webpage for boards, commissions, and committees. The VAC webpage includes general Committee functions, the work plan, public art strategy, link to sign up for Call for Artists, and meeting and agenda information.

There is also a page on Call for Artists drafted that staff uses to link current Call for Artists and provide brief overviews of recently closed Call for Artists. The page is not currently published since there are no open Call for Artists.

The Economic Development team posts public art spotlight posts to the Instagram account [@mved.biz](#). The Instagram account was created in January 2024, and there have been three posts on public art since the inception.

The Mountain View Center for the Performing Arts (CPA) [website](#) (managed by the Center for the Performing Arts staff) includes information about the artists displaying in the lobby. Joy Broom, who displayed November 28, 2023 to March 3, 2024, and Renee Bott, who is currently displaying until April 22, 2024, can be viewed on the CPA website now. Economic Development staff collaborates with the CPA staff to regularly update the photos with works of local artists on display at the CPA's lobby.

For comparison, below are examples of public art content on the websites of several of Mountain View’s neighboring communities:
