**SUBJECT:** Library Director's Report

#### **STAFF UPDATES**

The Library has filled two Senior Librarian positions. Court Fields has been promoted from Librarian II within the Adult and Digital division, while Renee Ting will move up from Librarian II in the Youth and Outreach Division. Both have been with the Mountain View Public Library for many years and were excited to start serving their respective divisions in these new roles on January 9.

#### FREE INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

The Library is once again partnering with United Way Bay Area to bring free tax preparation assistance to the community. Volunteers from the IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program will be at the Library on Saturdays and Tuesdays starting on January 28 to help low-income individuals file their State and Federal taxes. Assistance will be available on a first-come, first-served basis through Tax Day on April 18.

#### RENGSTORFF HOUSE MODEL

The family of the late Bay Area resident and former aeronautical engineer, Al Kuhn, stopped by the Mountain View History Center to donate a meticulously detailed model of the historic Rengstorff House. Mr. Kuhn had a passion for creating detailed models of airplanes, cars, trains, and more. He moved to the Bay Area after retiring and frequently went on walks with his wife that took them past the Rengstorff House. He was fascinated by the historic house and its grounds, and he thought it would be a fun modeling project. He took many photos and detailed measurements to ensure his replica would be accurate and, over the course of several weeks, built this exceptional model of the Rengstorff House. Library Director Tracy Gray met with Mr. Kuhn's widow, Liliane, and son Philip Kuhn, and accepted the model on behalf of the City of Mountain View.

The Rengstorff House is Mountain View's oldest home and one of the finest examples of Victorian Italianate architecture on the West Coast. Located at 3070 North Shoreline Boulevard, the Rengstorff House features a Victorian Italianate design with a hip roof, a central gable crowned by a widow's walk, a front portico, and a symmetrical room layout. The gracious dining room and four lovely parlors downstairs, all decorated with classic period décor, open up to brick patios surrounded by manicured lawns, blooming flowers, and natural areas. This historic Mountain View landmark was saved from destruction and fully restored in 1991.





#### **MORE CALIFORNIA STATE PARKS PASSES**

The Library received additional California State Parks passes from the California State Library to meet demand for the program. The Library now has 103 passes available for checkout, which cleared the holds list and left many additional passes available for families to enjoy the State Parks over the holiday break.

#### **NEW WAYS TO GET A LIBRARY CARD**

The Library is now issuing library cards to the public at the second-floor information desk. Customers who go to the second floor to use the public computers or reserve a study room will be able to use their photo ID to get a library card without having to go back downstairs to the customer service desk. This new offering will make services on the second floor more convenient for customers to access without having to visit multiple service points.

The Library participated in the City's annual Tree Lighting Ceremony on December 5, 2022. Children's Librarians Alex and Renee presented a special Mrs. Claus's Reading Corner storytime, where they shared holiday stories with 177 people during two sessions.




