SUBJECT: Library Director's Report

BOOKMOBILE RELAUNCH

The Library's Bookmobile service will be relaunching on Wednesday, October 12. The existing Bookmobile will continue to be in service as the Library waits on the new vehicle ordered at the end of Fiscal Year 2021-22.

At the time of services restarting, the Bookmobile will venture out into the community on Wednesdays and Thursdays, making two stops each day.

ELEVATE MV

The City of Mountain View officially launched the Elevate MV pilot program in September. The initiative of the City Council will provide 166 qualified Mountain View residents with a guaranteed basic income of \$500 per month for 24 months. The Library served as one of several support centers/application hubs to assist residents with submitting their application for the program. The Library provided space on Friday and Saturday for two consecutive weekends for the assistance. One hundred twenty (120) people received help applying in the first weekend of assistance, and 18 people came to the site the second weekend. The children's Librarians

provided a kids' table with coloring sheets, stickers, and books to help entertain kids while their parents received assistance.



24/7 ONLINE TUTORING

On September 12, Governor Gavin Newsom announced that every Californian can now access free online tutoring available 24/7 through a new initiative offering homework help in every K-12 subject and skill-building resources for adult learners. One-on-one tutoring assistance can be accessed through the Library's website at MountainView.gov/BrainfuseHelpNow.

The pilot program led by the California State Library offers assistance in math, language arts, and other core K-12 subjects in English, Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Vietnamese, and Tagalog. There is no age limit to who can use the service. Adult learners can also access writing assistance, citizenship resources, and other tools.

SAINT FRANCIS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT CONNECT CARDS

The Mountain View Public Library has partnered with Saint Francis High School (SFHS) to provide Student Connect Cards to all students in the school. With the Student Connect Cards, students will have access to the Library's digital resources, including e-books, e-audiobooks, online tutoring, and other informational databases. The Library created 2,139 cards for SFHS this fall. The partnership with SFHS expands upon the program established last school year with the Mountain View Los Altos Union High School District.

SCI-FI SEPTEMBER

The Library hosted another successful year of Sci-Fi September programming. Adult Services Librarian Kyle Hval planned a full slate of activities throughout the month on topics related to science fiction and the real science that inspires it.

The keynote event for the month was an author talk with *New York Times* best-selling author of the *Dresden Files* and *Codex Alera* series Jim Butcher. Kyle moderated the discussion based on audience questions about his books, writing process, inspiration, past TV series, and more. A total of 193 people tuned in live from across the country to watch the discussion and submit questions. The talk was recorded and posted on the <u>Library's YouTube page</u> for anyone to view. The video has over 4,400 views and 223 likes since it was posted on September 17. Jim was a delight to talk to, and the Library received a great deal of positive feedback from the audience in the chat.




Hugo Award-winning science fiction author Becky Chambers discussed her writing process and her latest novella, *A Prayer for the Crown-Shy*, with a crowd of 35. This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.

Paleontologist, professor, and best-selling author Steve Brusatte discussed his latest book, *The Rise and Reign of the Mammals*. Fourteen (14) people attended this author talk sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.

The monthly adult craft night went sci-fi with a "build your own spaceship" project. A group of nine used fabric scraps, LED lights, and other supplies to build their own interstellar creations. This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.





Heath D. Smith, a research scientist at KIPR in the Space Sciences and Astrobiology division at NASA Ames Research Center, joined the Library for a presentation. This in-person program was attended by a group of 12 that learned about the ocean worlds found on other planets, moons, and even comets around the solar system.

Illustrator Karen Luk presented an interactive workshop on creating fantastical beasts and imagined monsters for a virtual group of nine attendees. This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.

The Library welcomed back professional Celtic and Medieval music duo Margaret and Kristoph for a performance of original musical settings of songs from J.R.R. Tolkien's *Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit*. Nineteen (19) people turned out to watch the in-person performance.





Author Annalee Newitz returned to the Library to discuss their writing process, science journalism, and their new novel, *The Terraformers*. Nineteen (19) people attended this virtual presentation.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS FAIR


The Library participated in Assemblymember Marc Berman's Family Health and Wellness Fair in Mountain View on Saturday, September 24. There were nearly 1,000 attendees from the community that came by to speak with local exhibitors. Library staff spoke to community members about all the free services provided by the Library and presented a storytime for those in attendance.


PACIFIC LIBRARY PARTNERSHIP PANEL
