# 4.7 Additional City Funding Contribution to Support Development of 20 Units for City Employees as Part of the Mountain View Whisman School District BMR Residential Project at 777 West Middlefield Road

- 1. Appropriate \$1.06 million from the Strategic Property Acquisition Reserve to supplement the City's original \$2 million one-time funding contribution to support development of 20 low- and moderate-income units for City employees as part of the Mountain View Whisman School District below-market-rate residential project within the 777 West Middlefield Road project.
- 2. Direct staff to pay for the original \$2 million contribution amount through the Strategic Property Acquisition Reserve without reimbursement from the Below-Market-Rate Fund.
