**SUBJECT: Actions from the April 14, 2026 City Council Regular and Shoreline Regional Park Community Special Meeting**

At the City Council Regular and Shoreline Regional Park Community Special meeting on Tuesday, April 14, 2026, the following actions were taken:

- 3.1) By consensus, the Council indicated support for the staff recommendations for projects in the Draft Fiscal Year 2026-27 Capital Improvement Program
- 4.1) Adopted Ordinance No. 5.2026 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Approving a Zoning Map Amendment for the Properties Located at 922-950 San Leandro Avenue (APN 153-18-026 and 153-18-031) from the MM (General Industrial) Zoning District to the R3-1.5 (Multiple-Family Residential) Zoning District
- 4.2) Adopted Resolution No. 19086 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View, Acknowledging Receipt of the Mountain View Fire Department's Annual Inspection Report Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 13146.4
- 4.3) Acting in its capacity as the Board of Directors for the Shoreline Regional Park Community, authorized the Community Manager or designee to amend the professional services agreement with LSA Associates, LLC, a California corporation (Entity No. 2341614), for ongoing biological services at Shoreline at Mountain View to add \$105,000 for additional services for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$345,000
- 4.4) Accepted Miramonte Reservoir Fence Replacement, Project 23-42, and authorize the final contract payment  
  
Accepted SB-1 Streets Project (Castro Street Curb Ramp Improvements), Project 20-30, and authorize the final contract payment
- 4.5) Accepted the public improvements for the development at 300 Moffett Boulevard for maintenance throughout their useful life  
  
Accepted the public improvements for the development at 747 Dana Street for maintenance throughout their useful life
- 4.6) Authorized the City of Mountain View to participate in the National Opioid Settlement with six regional distributors/dispenser defendants: Associated Pharmacies, Inc (and

American Associated Pharmacies); J M Smith Corporation; Louisiana Wholesale Drug Company, Inc.; Morris and Dickson Co.; North Carolina Mutual Wholesale Drug Company, Inc.; and United Natural Foods, Inc. (including its subsidiaries SuperValu and Advantage Logistics) (Six Remnant Defendants), and authorized the City Manager or designee to execute related settlement participation forms and agreements, including, but not limited to, agreement(s) with the state or county for use of settlement proceeds without further Council action

- 4.7) Introduced an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Establishing an Entertainment Zone on Portions of Castro Street Consistent with Senate Bill 969 as Codified in Business and Professions Code Section 25692, and set a second reading for April 28, 2026
- 6.1) Adopted Resolution No. 19087 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View, Adopting City Council Policy A-13a, Disruption of Telephonic or Internet Service During City Council Meetings
- 6.2) Approved the Public Safety Building development financing plan

Adopted Resolution No. S-186 of the Board of Directors of the Shoreline Regional Park Community Amending the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Adopted Budget to Transfer and Appropriate \$25,500,000 from the Shoreline Regional Park Community Fund to CIP 20-49, Public Safety Building, Design

Adopted Resolution No. 19088 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Adopted Budget to Appropriate \$2,000,000 in the General Operating Fund for a Transfer to the Public Safety Building Reserve

- 6.3) Approved the City Manager's preliminary recommendations for the Fiscal Year 2026-27 General Operating Budget and Conveyance Tax Fund Budget, and directed staff to return to the June 9, 2026 Council meeting with a recommendation that right-sizes the Councilmember travel and training budget
- 7) Directed the City Manager to evaluate the question-and-answer process ahead of Council meetings to make the process more effective and efficient for the Council and staff
