Latest State Public Health Orders

County risk level	New cases	Positive tests
WIDESPREAD Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	More than 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	More than 8% Positive tests
SUBSTANTIAL Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	4 - 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	5 - 8% Positive tests
MODERATE Some indoor business operations are open with modifications	1 - 3.9 daily new cases (per 100k)	2 - 4.9% Positive tests
MINIMAL Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	Less than 1 daily new cases (per 100k)	Less than 2% Positive tests

“Blueprint for a Safer Economy”

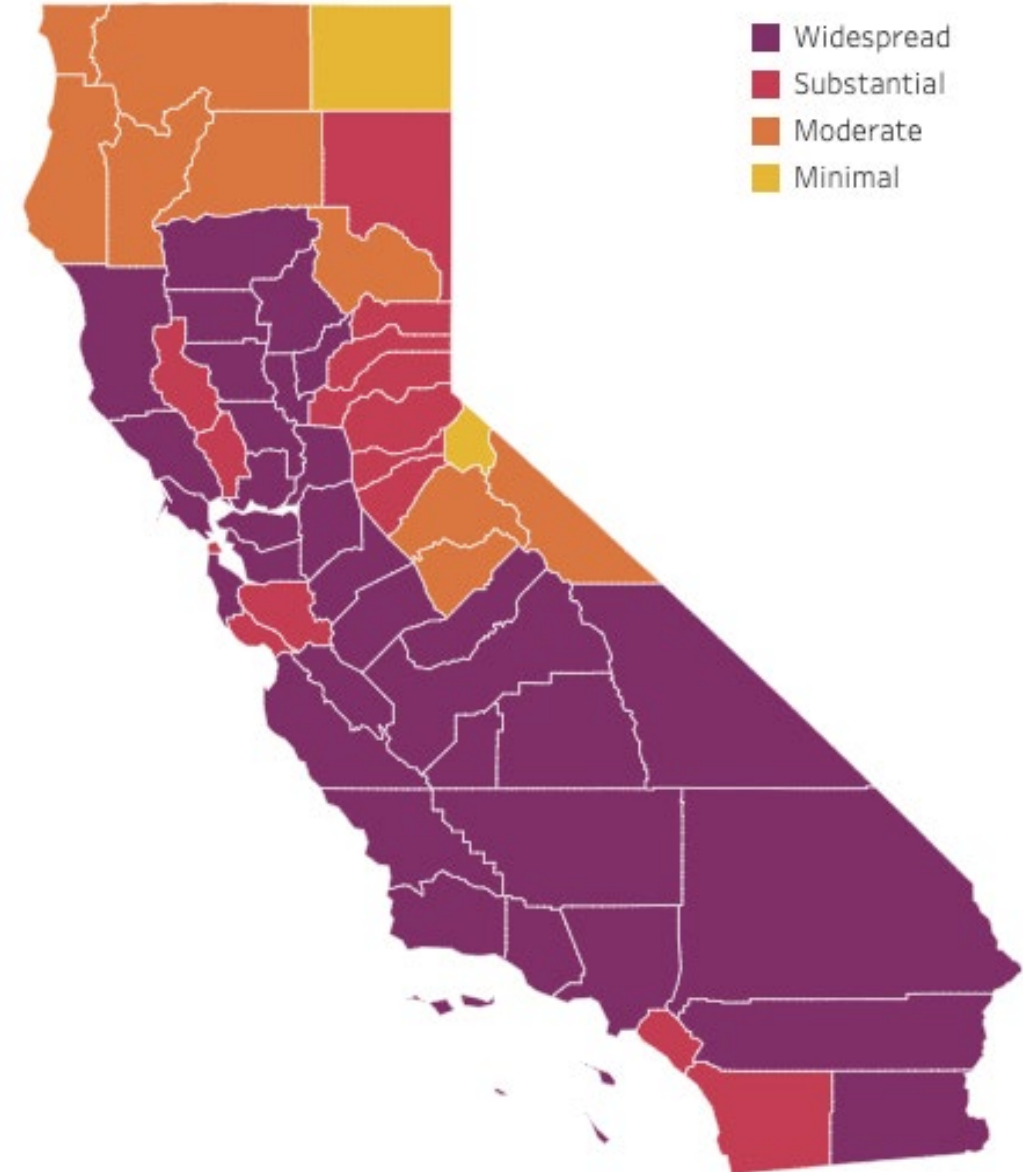
- Santa Clara moved to **RED TIER** today
- **Big Changes:**
 - Schools can reopen if in red tier for 14 days straight
 - Shopping malls can open indoors at 50% capacity
 - Personal care (nail salons) can open indoors
 - Gyms and fitness centers can open indoors at 10% capacity
- Minimum of 3 weeks in same tier before a County can move to the next tier
- Whichever guidelines are more strict will be used locally



Latest State Public Health Orders

Other Changes

- all retail would be able to open
- museums, zoos, aquariums open at designated County capacity
- Designated County capacity is based on what the business filed in their County Social Distancing Protocol
- Santa Clara County will not allow the following going forward until our numbers improve:
 - No indoor dining
 - No indoor gatherings
 - No indoor theaters
