TITLE: Ordinance Approving a Military

Equipment Funding, Acquisition, and Use

Policy (Second Reading)

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt an Ordinance of the City of Mountain View Adding Section 2.69.3, Entitled "Military Equipment Policy," to the Mountain View City Code in Compliance with Assembly Bill 481, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 1 to the Council report). (First reading: 6-0)

SUMMARY

On April 26, 2022, the City Council introduced an ordinance adding Section 2.69.3 to the Mountain View City Code, entitled "Military Equipment Policy," in compliance with Assembly Bill 481. The ordinance would approve the Military Equipment Policy. The policy describes each piece of military equipment and the authorized uses for each piece of equipment. If adopted, the Mountain View Police Department will prepare an annual military equipment report for review at a community meeting to include each use of military equipment, any complaints received, and any internal audits or other information about violations of the policy. Council asked that staff conduct this meeting with the Public Safety Advisory Board. Annually, at a Regular Meeting of the City Council, the policy will be presented for review and renewal.

The City Council approved the ordinance by a 6-0 vote. This is a second reading of the ordinance to adopt the military equipment funding, acquisition, and use policy. If approved, the ordinance will become effective on June 9, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact in adopting this ordinance and the military equipment policy.
