Community Outreach Officer	The Police Department has a Community Outreach Officer position as part of the Neighborhood and Events Services Unit that serves as a liaison between social services providers and unhoused and unstably housed residents.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Verbally shares information about available programs, resources and services • Conducts referrals • Physically distributes H/UH Resource Flyer to unhoused and unstably housed residents and posts on windshields of known vehicles used for living purposes
<i>Coordinating Together Network</i>	A network consisting of the local Emergency Assistance Network, community-based organizations (CBOs), volunteer groups, and government agencies that leverage resource to help as many people in need as possible.	Since 2020, the City has convened a standing meeting, called <i>Coordinating Together</i> , to share updates, resources, and information related to the unhoused and unstably housed residents.
