

City Council Meeting April 14, 2020

COVID-19 Rent Relief Program (C-19 RRP)

- On March 17, 2020 Council meeting approved \$500K of emergency rent relief program for residential tenants in Mountain View impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.
 - Council expressed support for additional funding if necessary
- Community Services Agency of Mountain View, Los Altos, and Los Altos Hills (CSA) administers the C-19 RRP on behalf of the City and began accepting applications on March 25, 2020
 - CSA has increased staff capacity for the program

C-19 RRP Parameters

Program Parameters

- Serve as broad a range of tenants as possible
- Serve up to 120% AMI households
- Need for assistance must be COVID-19 related

Eligibility

- Must meet one of the COVID-19 related impacts including the following:
 - Reduced wages/Loss of employment
 - Increased medical/childcare costs
- Household must be residing in a Mountain View rental unit or room with current lease agreement
- Other situations may qualify on a case by case basis as determined by CSA staff

Amount of Assistance

- Up to 2 month maximum, with the flexibility to extend based on need and/or program demand
- Up to \$3000 monthly maximum assistance

C-19 RRP Activity

- As of April 13, 2020, here is a summary of C-19 RRP
 - o 1,406 inquiries/applicants
 - o 726 contacted, 680 in queue to be contacted
 - 160 households processed.
 - On average rental assistance is \$2,085
 - o 5-15 checks mailed out per day;
 - o One week intake process
 - o \$330,610 of City funds disbursed to date.

- Entitlement HUD Program
 - City receives about \$550,000 annually
 - 15% for public services
 - Annual Action Plan reports City funding activities
 - Change in activity require a substantial amendment
 - Generally, a majority of the funds must be used for capital projects.

CARES Act

With the passage of the CARES Act, it allowed:

- Greater allocation of funding to public services
- Streamlines the allocation process
- These "allowances" are applicable as long as new activity directly addresses the impacts of the COVID-19 crises, the activity is eligible.
 - Eligible activities include rent assistance; meals for seniors sheltering in place; temporary vouchers for homeless persons.

Revised CDBG Allocation Recommendation

- HUD program updates are very fluid and changing by the minute-
 - Revised guidance as of April 13th Can use only FY 19-20 and 20-21 CDBG funds for COVID-19 purposes.

Group 1: Reallocate FY 2019-20 funds	\$435,000
Group 2: CDBG FY 20-21 funds	\$351,000
Group 3: CARES Act funds	\$348,702
TOTAL	\$1.13M

Revised Recommendations

- 1) Council approval of a substantial amendment to the 2019-20 Action Plan to provide funding for COVID-19 Rent Relief Program.
 - a. Reallocation of \$435,000 from 2019-20 Action Plan
 - b. Allocation of \$351,000 from the FY 2020-21 CDBG.
 - c. Allocation of \$348,702 of Mountain View's future CDBG funds made available through Federal stimulus COVID-19 Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act
- 2) Appropriate the aforementioned funds
