NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK PROCLAMATION

A proclamation for National Volunteer Week was held at the City Council meeting on Tuesday, April 22. Sewing with FabMo volunteer Gayatri Ratnam accepted the proclamation on behalf of the citywide volunteer program. The Library is grateful to Ratnam's three years of service and her constant dedication to the Sewing with FabMo program, and for fostering creativity and community for those who wish to explore their sewing skills and build meaningful connections with fellow residents.





SUMMER AT THE LIBRARY

The Library's Summer Reading Program will begin on Sunday, June 1. Residents are invited to register the whole family to read, discover and earn rewards through Thursday, July 31, and

attend special events such as concerts, STEAM activity sessions, magic shows and more. The Library's lineup of events can be previewed in the <u>Events Calendar</u>.

To celebrate the start of summer, the Library will hold a <u>Summer Reading Program Kick-Off</u> on Monday, June 9 in Pioneer Park. This all-ages extravaganza will feature lawn games, frozen treats and an interactive music performance by the Rhythm Builders.

The bookmobile also has new service locations and events planned for summer. It will provide service at Rengstorff Park during summer camp pickup in addition to providing service at its regular locations including MOVE MV parking lots, senior facilities and Google. New summer services include morning storytimes at the Magical Bridge Playground, evening visits to Castro Park and stops at Hope Services, a center for developmentally disabled adults. Later in the summer, families can look forward to a special Teddy Bear Tea Party at Bubb Park.

SPANISH LANGUAGE CIVIC LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The Library welcomed 20 participants from this year's Spanish Language Civic Leadership Academy on Wednesday, April 23. The cohort learned about the Library's place in City government, Board of Library Trustees, Friends of the Mountain View Library, and services and programs for adults and youths. The presentation included a live demonstration on how to access Digital Library resources such as PressReader and Hoopla, a raffle to win Amazon and Apple tablets, and a tour of the Library.





STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAY

The Library held Staff Development Day on Thursday, May 1 at Michael's at Shoreline with opening remarks from Assistant City Manager Audrey Seymour Ramberg and Board of Library Trustees Chair Kristin Higaki. The Library Director presented on Shaping Our Library of Tomorrow, a report compiled from a nine-month initiative that commenced in July 2024 and focused on the future of the Library through a facilitated, multi-phase process designed to strengthen internal operations, increase staff engagement and elevate community services.

A panel of officers from the Mountain View Police Department shared their experiences with the staff, discussed safety and provided advice on ways to work through sensitive interactions with the public. Staff spent the rest of the afternoon engaging in wellness and team building activities such as exploring Shoreline Park and learning more about the work their colleagues do for the Library.










PROGRAMS

Visitors provided enthusiastic support for the Library and spun the prize wheel, walking away with free pens, mugs, solar-powered charging blocks and more. Library staff created seven new library cards and interacted with 115 visitors.
