Martin Eichner

Martin Eichner was the Director of Dispute Resolution Programs for Project Sentinel for twelve years, ending in 2013. During his tenure at Project Sentinel, Mr. Eichner was responsible for local tenant-landlord mediation programs in twelve different Northern California jurisdictions. The programs in Fremont, Campbell and Palo Alto require mandatory mediation between tenants and landlords in certain types of disputes. A fourth program in the Town of Los Gatos includes modified rent control for rental properties of three or more units and a mobile home park. Since leaving Project Sentinel, he has continued to work as a mediator and arbitrator for these programs as well as for the City of Hayward rent control program.

Mr. Eichner played a role in drafting the rent control ordinance and regulations for Los Gatos and the mandatory mediation ordinance in Palo Alto. He has also created and presented a number of training programs on tenant-landlord issues.
