SUBJECT: Actions from the March 26, 2024 City Council Regular Meeting

At the City Council Regular meeting on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, the following actions were taken:

- 1) Found the proposed amendments to Chapter 8 (Buildings) of the Mountain View City Code to be exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15060(c)(2) of the CEQA Guidelines as the amendments will not result in a direct or reasonable foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment and Section 15060(c)(3) as the amendments are not a project as defined in Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines because it has no potential for resulting in physical change to the environment, directly or indirectly

Adopted Ordinance No. 3.2024 of the City of Mountain View Amending Sections 8.174.2, 8.174.4, 8.174.5, and 8.174.8 of Chapter 8 (Buildings), Article VIII (Floodplain Management) of the Mountain View City Code to Bring the Design and Installation of Manufactured Homes into Compliance with the Federal Emergency Management Agency National Flood Insurance Program and Finding the Ordinance is Not a Project Under the California Environmental Quality Act

- 2) Adopted Resolution No. 18875 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending Council Policy A-10, Authorization to Execute City Contracts and Agreements
- 3) Adopted Resolution No. 18876 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Acknowledging Receipt of a Report Made by the Mountain View Fire Chief Regarding the Required Annual Inspection of Certain Occupancies Pursuant to Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 of the California Health and Safety Code
- 4) Accepted the 2023 General Plan Annual Progress Report and directed staff to submit the report to the Governor's Office of Planning and Research
- 5) Adopted Resolution No. 18877 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Authorizing the Temporary Closure of Parking Lot No. 11 from 7:30 a.m. through 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 19, 2024, for Use by the City of Mountain View Fire Department to Support the 150th Year Parade and Celebration

- 6) Approved plans and specifications for Evelyn Park, Project 21-60, and authorized staff to advertise the project for bids

Authorized the City Manager or designee to award the construction contract to the lowest responsible responsive bidder if the bid is within the project budget of \$2,395,000

- 7) Found that in accordance with California Environmental Quality Act requirements, City Hall Remodel (Community Development Department Reception Area Phase), Project 16- 64, was categorically exempt under California Public Resources Code Section 15301, Existing Facilities

Approved plans and specifications for City Hall Remodel (Community Development Department Reception Area Phase), Project 16-64, and authorized staff to advertise the project for bids

Authorized the City Manager or designee to award a construction contract to the lowest responsible responsive bidder if the bid is within the total project budget of \$2,000,000

- 8) Adopted Resolution No. 18878 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Finding that the Action Taken and Activities Approved Herein Are Not Projects Subject to California Environmental Quality Act Procedures, and Authorizing the City Manager or Designee to: (1) Apply for the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Climate Pollution Reduction Grant; (2) Sign Letters of Intent to Participate in the Community-Scale Reusable Foodware System Design and Implementation Project and the Public Facilities Resiliency Implementation Project; and (3) Negotiate and Execute Required Memorandums of Agreement with Partnering Agencies by July 1, 2024
- 9) Considered the 2023 Annual Progress Report: 2023-31 Housing Element and directed staff to forward the report to the California Department of Housing and Community Development and the Governor's Office of Planning and Research

Introduced an Ordinance of the City of Mountain View Approving Amendments to Chapter 36 (Zoning) of the City Code Amending the Development Standards and Permitting Process For Emergency Shelters, and Finding the Amendment to Be Categorically Exempt Under Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines, and set a second reading for April 23, 2024

Adopted Resolution No. 18879 of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending the El Camino Real Precise Plan to Add Emergency Shelters as a Permitted/Provisionally Permitted Use and to Include Permitting Process for Shelters, Consistent with the Housing Element Program 1.1.f, and Finding the Amendment to Be

Categorically Exempt Under the California Environmental Quality Act, Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3)

Directed staff to prepare future zoning and/or precise plan amendments to allow emergency shelters by right throughout the El Camino Real Precise Plan, except confirmed historic resources, upon completion of the analysis of the historic significance of the identified El Camino Real sites (*see Option 2 for Options to Expand Allowing Emergency Shelters by-Right in Precise Plan Area, page 19 of the staff report*).

- 10) Consensus to direct staff to bring options to CPPC regarding public virtual participation policies to mitigate Zoom bombing.
