**TITLE:** **Alice Okuno v. City of Mountain View Settlement Agreement**

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Authorizing and Directing the City Attorney to Compromise and Settle the Case of *Alice Okuno v. City of Mountain View*, Santa Clara County Superior Court Case No. 22CV405643, in the Amount of Two Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000) and Authorizing the City Manager or Designee to appropriate the same amount to the City Attorney's Office Liability Insurance Fund to Implement the Settlement, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 1 to Council Report). (Five Votes Required)

### **BACKGROUND**

On October 13, 2022, Alice Okuno filed a lawsuit in Santa Clara County Superior Court against the City of Mountain View ("City"), seeking damages arising from an October 28, 2021, trip and fall incident in a City park.

City Council authorized the settlement of this case in closed session on November 18, 2025.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

Adoption of the attached resolution will result in the appropriation of Two Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$275,000) to the City Attorney's Office Liability Insurance Fund for implementation of this settlement. The Liability Insurance Fund has a sufficient balance to support this appropriation request.

### **LEVINE ACT**

California Government Code Section 84308 (also known as the Levine Act) prohibits city officials from participating in any proceeding involving a "license, permit, or other entitlement for use" if the official has received a campaign contribution exceeding \$500 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant within the last 12 months. The Levine Act is intended to prevent financial influence on decisions that affect specific, identifiable persons or participants. For more
