## **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Reappointing Sharon Su to the Board of Library Trustees; Reappointing Jonathan Davis and Appointing IdaRose Sylvester to the Parks and Recreation Commission; Reappointing Marisol Melara, Mike Kasperzak, Peter Katz, and Jamil Shaikh and Appointing Peter Reiter to the Downtown Committee; Appointing Irina Crone to the Performing Arts Committee; and Appointing David Kim and Michelle Maguire to the Senior Advisory Committee, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 1 to the Council report).

## **BACKGROUND**

On October 27, 2025, the Council Appointments Review Committee interviewed nine applicants for openings on the Board of Library Trustees, Parks and Recreation Commission, Downtown Committee, Performing Arts Committee, and Senior Advisory Committee. On November 17, 2025, the Council Appointments Review Committee interviewed eight applicants for openings on the Parks and Recreation Commission and Senior Advisory Committee. The Council Appointments Review Committee made recommendations for appointments and terms as outlined in Attachment 1.

The Council Appointments Review Committee also recommended reappointing Jamil Shaikh to the Downtown Committee (Neighborhood) seat, which is a seat filled by election of the Old Mountain View Neighborhood Association. Jamil Shaikh's current term on the Downtown Committee (Neighborhood) expires on December 31, 2025, and he is running unopposed for the position of neighborhood liaison. The Old Mountain View Neighborhood Association's election is on December 15, 2025.

Remaining vacancies on all boards, commissions, and committees will be advertised again for further recruitment and consideration by the Council Appointments Review Committee.

## **LEVINE ACT**

California Government Code Section 84308 (also known as the Levine Act) prohibits city officials from participating in any proceeding involving a "license, permit, or other entitlement for use" if the official has received a campaign contribution exceeding \$500 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant within the last 12 months. The Levine Act is intended to prevent financial influence on decisions that affect specific, identifiable persons or participants.
