SUBJECT: Safe Routes to School Final Report FY 2024-2025

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Receive the final report for Mountain View's Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Safe Routes to School program was created in 2011. Over the years, the program has grown more robust. Staff reports annually to the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) and this year staff committed to providing an end-of-year status update to CTC on the program.

On May 3, 2022, staff provided an update on the program for FY 2021-22 to the Council Transportation Committee (CTC). CTC provided feedback to foster partnerships with schools and school districts, and to coordinate with the City of Los Altos, ensuring that Mountain View students attending schools in Los Altos receive the same SRTS education. Staff incorporated this feedback into the program.

On May 23, 2023, the City Council approved a three-year contract with NN Engineering (with Safe Moves as a subconsultant) for SRTS services for the FY 2023-24, FY 24-25 and FY 25-26.

BPAC received the SRTS FY 2019–23 Final Report on March 7, 2024, and the FY 2023–24 Final Report on March 11, 2025. The reports documented SRTS activities, including safety training, bike rodeos, suggested route maps, and summaries of student and parent surveys. On May 28, 2025, BPAC received a comprehensive program update on recent activities, program evaluation and structure.

## **ANALYSIS**

The Final Report documents SRTS program activities and events in Mountain View for Fiscal Year 2024-25. The final report also documented the results of the student tally mode share and parent survey results for the 2024-25 school year.

In Fiscal Year 2025-26, the City is continuing education and encouragement activities, including safety assemblies and bike rodeos at all elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as Citywide events, such as the Monster Bash Bike Circus and bike rodeos during Earth Day. Staff is also developing infrastructure recommendations to improve safety and accessibility for students. Staff also continues to work with Mountain View Whisman School District staff on school-specific SRTS curricula.
