We're proud to offer this new resource as part of our ongoing commitment to creating a welcoming and inclusive environment for families.






DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY

The Library recently became a Local Program Partner with <u>Dolly Parton's Imagination Library</u>. The Imagination Library is a worldwide program that mails free books to children 0-5 years old to support literacy and instill a love for reading. Families may register children online at <u>SCCLD.org/ImaginationLibrary</u>.

CURIOSITY COLLECTION

Children can now borrow Curiosity Collection kits from the desk in the Children's Room. Each box includes a book and engaging hands-on activities that bring its themes to life, inspiring imagination and learning. The kits can be enjoyed in the Library and will be refreshed regularly, so there's always something new to explore.







NEW ITEMS IN LIBRARY OF THINGS

The Library now offers <u>ukulele kits</u> and <u>bird watching backpacks</u> that customers can borrow from the Customer Service desk. The ukulele kit includes a ukulele, tuner, and beginner's book. The bird watching backpack contains two pairs of binoculars, a California bird field guide, and an information card. Each kit may be borrowed for two weeks.





NATIONAL FRIENDS OF LIBRARIES WEEK

The Library celebrated National Friends of Libraries Week from Oct. 19-25. Since 1975, the Friends have raised over \$1.3 million for the Library through quarterly Book Sales, the Lobby Shop, and online sales. Funds raised by the Friends go toward Summer Reading, Sci-Fi September, and Silicon Valley Reads programs, as well as concert and craft programs throughout the year. Funds also go toward the Lucky Day collection and extra copies of popular titles.

In recognition of National Friends of Libraries Week, staff created a video for <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> that highlights the Friends and all the work they do to support the Library.

MONSTER BASH

The Library participated in the city-wide Monster Bash event on Saturday, Oct. 25. Attending staff interacted with 748 table visitors. Staff held three Halloween-themed storytimes, distributed craft kits to children, offered library cards, and shared information about everything the Library offers.



WINTER EVENTS

Staff have lined up several festive events to celebrate the holiday season.

Residents who enjoy music will have the opportunity to hear the <u>Bel Canto Flutes</u> ensemble perform melodies old and new, spanning genres from Bach to rock, on Tuesday, Dec. 9. Those who are interested in playing music are invited to the <u>Winter Holiday Yule-kulele Jam</u> on Wednesday, Dec. 10, to learn how to play seasonal songs on the ukulele.

A special performance by <u>Firelight Shadow Theater</u> on Saturday, Dec. 13, will introduce attendees to the art of shadow puppetry and perform shadow puppetry versions of best-loved stories, including wintry folktales.

Lastly, kids will be excited to come to the Library's annual <u>Winter Dance Party</u> on Tuesday, Dec. 16, where the Library DJ will play both popular and seasonal songs to get everyone moving and shaking.
