 1. Adopt the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Annual Action Plan for Community Development Block Grant and Home Investment Partnership Program funds, as shown in Attachment 1.

 Allocate approximately \$2,130,000 (\$1,080,000 of available Community Development Block Grant and \$1,050,000 of available Home Investment Partnership Program funds for capital projects, including affordable housing projects).
 Allocate \$180,000 in Community Development Block Grant funding to Rebuilding Together Peninsula for the minor home repair program.
