5.2 Tenant Relocation Assistance Ordinance Modifications

Recommendation: That the Environmental Planning Commission (EPC) Adopt a Resolution Recommending the City Council Adopt an Ordinance Amending Article XIII of Chapter 36 of the Mountain View City Code Related to Tenant Relocation Assistance, to include the following modifications:

1. Increase the income eligibility for TRAO, adjusted by household size, by an additional \$5,000.

2. Increase the amount of additional relocation assistance for special-circumstance households from \$3,000 to \$5,000.

3. Require enhanced assistance by a relocation agency in searching for replacement housing.

4. Require County recording of Notice of Ellis Act/TRAO Requirements.
