In 2020 the voters of Mountain View chose Sally Lieber to represent us and our progressive values. She has stood up for mobile home stabilization, safe parking, as well as having a vision for improving our downtown. We want to be sure those values remain constant with the planned reorganization, regardless of our the vacancy is filled.

However, I feel very strongly that a special election reflecting the views of Mountain View residents should be held to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Sally Lieber. Here are some of the specific reasons:
