

Subcommittee Outreach Themes

- RIPA data should be provided online
- RIPA data should be manipulatable
- Data reports should be readable in Mandarin, Russian and Spanish.
- Importance of access to community to interpret data
- RIPA data can inform community members' feeling of safety with the MVPD, inform community aid providers on how to help their clients, identify patterns or problems, and prompt early intervention
- Providing access to printed RIPA data reports will increase the access to community members who may not otherwise review it online.

- Frequent posting of RIPA data will support transparency efforts of the MVPD
- Identifying RIPA data related to discrimination would better identify concerning trends early



Subcommittee Recommendations

- Officer Level RIPA compliance reviews
- Creation of an interactive dashboard displaying RIPA data in a format that is easily viewed on mobile devices
- Quarterly publication of RIPA data in CSV format
- Quarterly publication of the RIPA data in English, Spanish, Russian, and Mandarin for posting on The City's webpage
- Distribution to stakeholders in both an electronic and hard copy format
- Availability of RIPA data upon request at the police station
- Continued opportunities for the MVPD to listen to community voices and look for new and more effective means to make its RIPA data transparent and accessible to the entire community



Potential Next Steps

- Continue to collect RIPA data and the additional data sets
- Ensure continued external RIPA data analysis
- Research and implement a RIPA dashboard
- Publish quarterly RIPA data in English, Spanish, Russian and Mandarin on the City webpage
- Develop the future RIPA data page for the Cities webpage restructuring
- Make quarterly RIPA data available upon request
- Publication of access to RIPA data
- Draft and implement more detailed RIPA policy
