TITLE: Adoption of Legislative Platform for

2022

RECOMMENDATION

1. Adopt the Legislative Platform to guide the City's regional, State, and Federal legislative advocacy efforts for 2022.

2. Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending City Council Policy A-16, Representing the City on Regional Boards or Other Bodies, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 4 to the Council report).

BACKGROUND

On January 25, 2022, the City Council held a Study Session to provide input on the proposed legislative platform issues to guide the City's legislative advocacy during the 2022 legislative session. The Study Session memo is included as Attachment 1.

Staff and Renne Public Policy Group (RPPG), the City's legislative advocacy consultant, developed the proposed Legislative Platform based on input received during in-depth meetings with City Councilmembers and key staff from all City departments held from November 2021 through January 2022. The platform consists of 11 issue areas with 97 policy statements, reflecting the most important legislative priorities and issues discussed during these meetings (Attachment 1).

ANALYSIS

2022 Legislative Platform

At the Study Session on January 25, a majority of the Council indicated support for the following:

The modification of two policy statements to include additional language;

- The change of advocacy position from support or oppose to monitor/watch for four policy statements;
- The addition of eight new legislative policy statements; and
- Clarification that the State Legislative Platform may be used to address Federal matters.

Council also discussed Councilmember comments that for some policy statements it was unclear what specific legislation, as it is ultimately introduced or amended, would include and whether a support position would be appropriate. It was suggested that a support position for some legislation would depend on whether the legislation placed an unfunded mandate on the City or eroded the City's control to set policy locally. Council directed staff to review the policy statements and recommend adding a footnote, where appropriate, that the support position was contingent on there not being an unfunded mandate or an impact on local control.

• Staff conducted this assessment and has added a footnote to 18 policy statements in the issue areas of Homelessness, Housing and Community Development, Economic Development, and Water Quality and Water Supply.

In addition to the above input, staff proposes a new policy statement be added to the Economic Development issue area:

• Taking into account the vital importance of equitable ADA access, support legislation that would provide the needed education, financial resources, and access to ADA-compliance experts for the Mountain View business community.

Staff has incorporated the changes summarized above in Attachment 2 (red-line version) and Attachment 3.

Update to Council Policy A-16—Positions on Ballot Measures and Legislative Advocacy

During the Study Session, Council discussed an interest in clarifying how the City's Legislative Platform is used when Councilmembers are voting as members of regional boards. The Council agreed that Councilmember votes should be consistent with the City's adopted Legislative Platform when the Councilmember was appointed to the regional board by the City Council and is, therefore, representing the City. Council requested that staff return with an update to Council Policy A-16 to incorporate language

to this effect. The proposed update is included in Section 2, Item 3, of Council Policy A-16 (Attachment 5).

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with the adoption of the Legislative Platform program for 2022.

- 2. Modify the Legislative Platform program for 2022.
