FRIENDS OF THE MOUNTAIN VIEW LIBRARY UPDATE

The Friends of the Mountain View Library held their first full book sale of the new fiscal year on Saturday, August 13. They added eight new members to their organization and raised \$4,552 that will go toward supporting Library programs, services, and collections. Past Program Highlights

The Library hosted "What is Magic?" with Brian Scott on August 3. This was not just a magic show. A group of 191 attendees learned several behind-the-scenes magic skills and received sample take-home props that they can use to perform their own magic tricks.



Astronaut Boot Camp provided an opportunity for early elementary students to use math, science, physics, and astronomy in key physical and mental challenges to prepare them to be astronauts. Thirty-five (35) explorers joined in on the fun.



The Library hosted wildlife photographer Joan Sparks for a presentation on the Principles of Photography. Joan taught a group of 24 attendees about composition, light, color, and other techniques to help them capture the best images possible. This program was generously sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.



August 12 is set aside as International Youth Day by the United Nations to recognize the accomplishments of youth around the world and empower them to make positive contributions to society. The Library hosted a drop-in craft program where 32 children created bracelets with colored beads corresponding to their country of origin and used lettered beads to write an inspiring word or phrase.



The monthly Drop-in Bike Clinic, sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library, continues to be a popular regular program at the Library. Bike mechanic Ryan Murphy is back after a pandemic break to help people perform maintenance on their two wheeled rides using the Library's Dero Fix-it station. Seventeen (17) people received help at the session in August.
