My name is David Garcia. I am a 5th generation Mountain View resident. Growing up in our city as a queer Mexican American individual, the performing arts played an essential role in my development as a connected and critically conscious adult. The Performing Arts Committee has the opportunity to have a deep and wide approach in order to support our community. With a needs-based approach, I look forward to expanding opportunities for traditionally marginalized voices in our city with the performing arts committee.

I am an alumnus of both the MVWSD and MVLA districts, participating in their robust performing arts programs. After high school, I attended Chapman University to pursue my bachelor of music in music education. At Chapman, I had the opportunity to hone my musical skills and work with acclaimed musicians, studying classical, jazz, early, and mariachi styles of music. In 2020, amidst the Black Lives Matter protests, students at Chapman's conservatory of music were hungry for change. Together, I helped create the Musicians of Color Association (MoCA) in order to better support the needs and concerns of Students of Color. Since our start, MoCA has hosted and cohosted multiple DIEA summits, community concerts, and advocacy-oriented community organizing on campus.

After graduating in the summer of 2022, I returned to Mountain View. I now teach music at the elementary level in several schools from Sunnyvale to San Mateo. Currently, I am piloting a culturally relevant, community-oriented after-school music program for socio-economically disadvantaged students at Mountain View's Title I school, Castro Elementary.

Music and the arts serve as a conduit for the creation of community and connection. However, the arts remain a space that is inaccessible to marginalized individuals and communities, yet are spaces that underpin the essence of culture and diversity. If we are to support a robust and thriving community, it starts with the arts.

I look forward to working with the performing arts committee to further initiatives that enrich our community through arts and enrich our connection to self and to community.
