TITLE:	Permanente Creek Pedestrian/Bicycle Trail Old Middlefield Way to Rock Street, Project 12-35 – Accept Construction

RECOMMENDATION

Accept Permanente Creek Pedestrian/Bicycle Trail Old Middlefield Way to Rock Street, Project 12-35, and authorize final contract payment.

BACKGROUND

On August 30, 2013, the City Manager awarded the construction contract for Permanente Creek Pedestrian/Bicycle Trail Old Middlefield Way to Rock Street, Project 12-35, to Star Construction, Inc., of San Bruno, California, at the low bid price of \$278,704 which included a \$30,000 construction contingency. The project constructed a 10' wide paved pedestrian/bicycle trail extension to Permanente Creek Trail from Old Middlefield Way to Rock Street. The project included construction of sidewalk, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) curb ramp, and median refuge area on Rock Street, and landscape work and new fencing along the trail.

ANALYSIS

The final construction cost of \$254,663 is within the construction budget of \$278,704 and included two change orders to repair an existing cracked concrete slab, install a convex mirror for improved visibility, and a final item adjustment change order totaling \$5,959. All work has been completed in accordance with the plans and specifications.

FISCAL IMPACT

Permanente Creek Pedestrian/Bicycle Trail Old Middlefield Way to Rock Street, Project 12-35, is funded with \$100,000 from the Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA), \$228,210 from Park Land Dedication Fund, and a \$150,000 donation from Google Inc. for a total budget of \$478,210. The total project expenditure is approximately \$440,000. The remaining balance will be returned to the Park Land Dedication Fund.

ALTERNATIVES

Determine that the improvements have not been completed in conformance with City standards and decline to accept the improvements until they are completed to the satisfaction of the Council.
