#### 4. ORAL COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC ON NONAGENDIZED ITEMS

Don Letcher expressed concerns with the City flying the Gay Pride flag at City Hall, and with various actions taken by Council that he referred to as a "nanny government."

Esteban Guerrero, representing a team of Stanford Grad students, presented information regarding a study they conducted on the five value views of the San Antonio Phase II project.

Lucas Ramirez urged Council to expedite the Housing Element review and implementation plan.

Randy Jones spoke in support of raising the minimum wage in the City of Mountain View.

John Moellinger expressed concerns with the blighted condition of property located on the 500 block of Escuela. Mr. Moellinger also responded to Council's questions.

Jim Neal presented information regarding his attendance at the San Francisco Planning & Urban Research meeting held at the Adobe Building last evening, and he expressed concerns with the transit system and the need for housing in the City of Mountain View.

Alison Hicks, with the Coalition to Raise the Minimum Wage in Mountain View, expressed appreciation to Council for its support on the issue, and she presented information on the International Monetary Fund's recent article on the subject, as well as actions currently being undertaken by the Coalition in support of raising the minimum wage.
