CURRENT WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

Permanent Water Use Prohibitions

- 1. Using hoses without an automatic shut-off device for washing automobiles or other vehicles, driveways, patios, or sidewalks.
- 2. Wasting potable water by allowing it to run off into gutters, sidewalks, streets, or other hard-surfaced areas.
- 3. Serving water in restaurants, except on request.
- 4. Wasting water because of broken or defective plumbing, sprinklers, watering, or irrigation systems.
- 5. Installing single-pass cooling systems on new construction.

Stage 2 Water Use Prohibitions

- 1. Wasting water from broken or defective water systems (must be repaired within five days).
- 2. Washing paved or hard surfaces, except by bucket or for health and safety reasons
- 3. At-home vehicle washing, except by bucket.
- 4. Watering or irrigating landscapes:
 - Between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. (except by bucket, hose, or for system repair).
 - More than three days per week (for each irrigation station).
 - More than 15 minutes per day (except for drip irrigation or for system repair).
 - During or within 48 hours following rain events.*
- 5. Using potable water in decorative water features, except to sustain aquatic life (provided the water is recirculated).
- 6. Using nonwater-conserving dishwashing spray valves in restaurants.

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^{* 48-}hour limit is per State mandate not City Code.

- 7. Providing new linens to hotel guests without offering reuse options.
- 8. Constructing or installing and operating new commercial car washes and commercial laundry systems that do not use water-recirculating technologies.
- 9. Using potable water for construction needs when recycled water is readily available.

CURRENT WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAMS

Free Devices and Programs

- Showerheads, shower timer, toilet flappers, faucet aerators, toilet leak-detection tablets, toilets (for businesses and apartments).
- Water-wise house calls, landscape surveys, and landscape water budget reports.
- Landscape education classes.
- School presentations.

Rebates for Water-Efficient Equipment and Landscaping

 Clothes washers, toilets, urinals, graywater laundry-to-landscape systems, lowwater-use plants, irrigation equipment, submeters, connectionless food steamers, air-cooled ice machines, and any commercial equipment or process change that saves water.
