CITY OF MOUNTAIN VIEW RESOLUTION NO. SERIES 2016

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN VIEW DECLARING THE RESULT OF THE CANVASS OF RETURNS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016 FOR THE ELECTION OF FOUR MEMBERS TO THE CITY COUNCIL AND FOR BALLOT MEASURES V AND W

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2016, the City Council of the City of Mountain View duly passed and adopted Resolution No. 18067 specifying the date of the General Municipal Election which was held in the City of Mountain View on November 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, said General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, in accordance with the law and the votes thereat were received and canvassed and the results thereof have been certified in all respects as required by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Mountain View as follows:

- 1. That the City Clerk of the City of Mountain View be, and is hereby instructed to enter this resolution on the minutes of the Council as a statement of the results of said election.
- 2. That the whole number of ballots cast in the City of said General Municipal Election was 32,269 and that a full and correct copy of the statement of results of said election for Council seats and for Measures V and W were canvassed and certified by the County Registrar of Voters is attached hereto as Attachment 1 and incorporated herein by reference.
- 3. That at said election, Lisa Matichak, Margaret Abe-Koga, Chris Clark, and John McAlister received the highest number of votes for the four Council seats for full four-year terms and have been elected as Councilmembers.
- 4. That as a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on Measure V Charter Amendment Relating to Rent Stabilization, voted for it and that the measure was carried and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.
- 5. At said election, a majority of the voters approved both Measure V (The Community Fair Rent and Stabilization Act) and Measure W—Rent Stabilization Ordinance. However, because Measure V is a Charter Amendment, it prevails over

Measure W because it is an ordinance. The Charter is superior to and supersedes the City ordinances.
