5.1 LIBRARY BUDGET

There are two opportunities for the Library Board to provide input to the City Council on the Library budget. The first will be for the March 28 study session on the Capital Improvement Program and the next is the April 28 meeting on the narrative budget. The CIP budget is especially critical this year as there are three potential Library projects: remodel, joining the CENIC high speed network, and upgrading the Library's automated materials handling system.

The City Council will be having a goal setting meeting on February 27 from 5:30 to 8:30pm. Department Heads are required to attend and this conflicts with the Library Board meeting. I would like to discuss the possibility of holding the Library Board meeting another day that week.

SILICON VALLEY READS

Silicon Valley Reads is an annual community program that selects books focused on a contemporary theme and offers free events throughout Santa Clara County to engage the public in reading, thinking and discussing the topic. The goals are to encourage the love of reading and learning and to have a welcoming forum where our diverse community can come together to share different perspectives. Mountain View has participated for the past five years and will again this year, with generous sponsorship from the Friends of the Library.

In 2017, the 15th anniversary, Silicon Valley Reads focuses on "... and justice for all," a conversation about the unconscious biases we all have, and how these assumptions, perceptions and prejudices can lead to people being treated unfairly, especially in the legal system. Everyone has, at one time or another, been unfairly judged because of some type of bias and the goal is to raise awareness and spark new ideas on how we can reduce bias in our legal system and our daily lives.

This year's books are *Unfair: The New Science of Criminal Injustice* by Adam Benforado and *Writing My Wrongs: Life, Death, and Redemption in an American Prison* by Shaka Senghor. Adam Benforado, an associate professor of law at Drexel University, will be at the Mountain View Library on March 21 in the evening to discuss his book.
