5.1 BROWN ACT PRESENTATION

Nicole Wright from the City Attorney's office will present an overview of the Brown Act.

5.2 REMODEL UPDATE AND ARTWORK FOR NEW CHILDREN'S AREA

We are in the process of finalizing the contract for our construction contractor who will then provide us with a schedule of the work. I expect construction to begin in about a month and to be complete by the end of the fiscal year. I will share the exact schedule with you as soon as I have it.

The Visual Arts Committee recommended artwork for the entrance to the new children's area. This was presented to the City Council and unanimously approved at their meeting on October 3, 2017. A copy of the staff report is included in your packet. Here is an image of the art:

In preparation for the construction in the children's area, two storage containers have been placed in the Franklin Street surface parking lot. The shelving and other materials that are removed from the children's area will be stored in these containers until they can be returned to the space after construction is complete and the new carpeting has been installed.



While not visible to the public, we are also doing some work behind the scenes. Our Support Services staff is moving from the first floor to the second floor on October 13, and will be temporarily located in the area where we formerly housed back issues of print periodicals. Their current staff area will be reconfigured to accommodate both Support Services and Children's staff. Once that work is complete, both departments will move into the new area on the first floor. Then the former periodical area will be remodeled and made into a new reading area for the public.

We are putting together our communication strategy for keeping the public informed about the remodel. We have large posters at both reference desks showing the floorplans, we have a first draft of a Frequently Asked Questions document, and we will be creating a special section on our website with information about the project and regular updates. Once the construction schedule is known we will ramp up our efforts to share that with the public.

5.3 BENCHMARK REPORT - DISCUSS GOALS AND CONTENT

The Library Board has been producing a benchmark report since 2005. Attached is the original report. The original goals seem to have been to provide context for the FY 2005-06 budget and restore the \$50,000 that was cut from the materials budget. Also attached is the most current report that was completed last spring. My recommendation is to review the goals of the report and discuss roles and responsibilities of the Library Board and Library Director.
