- 1075 Terra Bella new 2-story, 19,301 square-foot office building. Approved.
- 1185 Terra Bella Avenue new two-story, 9,700 square foot commercial office building to replace two existing commercial buildings. Approved.

We are the neighbors of Stierlin Estates neighborhood and we request your support to stop developers from dividing our community:

- Sign this petition if you agree with the petition. Leave it at your front door under the mat or tape it to your front door in the morning. We'll come pick it up on Sat 8/18
- Support the petition guidelines at the city planning meeting on 8/25/18. Please attend the
 workshop and join your neighbors to support the best interests of our neighborhood and
 make our voices loud and clear.

- New development adjacent to existing residential communities should be zoned for light residential as shown in the maps to ensure the continuing safety of all residents and discourage vagrancy and loitering
- Any new buildings, including commercial, office, retail, or residential buildings must have sufficient off-street
 parking to match or exceed the sum legal occupancy of all rooms and structures within said new buildings or
 developments (assuming 1 car per adult occupant)
- Some **medium density housing** (structures with 2 levels or less or 20 feet or less and 65% of land has structures built on top of it) is reasonable to build, but only north of Terra Bella and south of 101 to allow a reasonable return on investment to Terra Bella investors. Housing close to existing neighborhoods should be 1-story
- All new neighborhoods should have walkable streets accessible to the public
- Some light retail and office space is reasonable to build, but only west of Linda Vista Ave. The existing office
 building newly constructed on Shoreline and Terra Bella is too large and is an example of over-active development
 and should not be replicated. Newer structures should be no more than 3 levels or 40 feet, whichever is less
- The 85-south on-ramp accessible to residents of Terra Bella properties and surrounding communities on Shoreline
 avenue must be preserved as limiting access to this on-ramp would create traffic and congestion hazards throughout
 the communities in the Shoreline area that would be dangerous to local children
- Existing large trees in the Terra Bella properties should not be removed as this significantly harms the view and enjoyment of all Mountain View residents, including the residents of Stierlin Estates and surrounding communities, and any potential new residents yet to come
- The planning commission should stick to the provided zoning map and the zoning guidelines (No spying, buffers, etc...) above when considering rezoning for the Terra Bella plan and new development in north Mountain View. The zoning map is separable, so if a zoning commitment that contradicts the map has already been made, the planning commission should continue to consider the rest of the map

Some further suggestions to improve Mountain View for current and future residents

- Close off San Pablo at its East End to reduce through-traffic through the neighborhood and improve the safety
 of children and elderly living on San Pablo and in the Stierlin Estates neighborhood
- Make on-street parking in residential communities more expensive to discourage car ownership
- Provide a connection to Steven's Creek Trail from the East Terra Bella area
