#### Seed Library

Did you know that the Library has a <u>Seed Library on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor</u> where members of the public can get free seeds?

The Seed Library is stocked by volunteers who come weekly to package, label, and organize donated seeds. This year, our volunteers have packaged over 10,000 seed packets so members of the community can borrow, grow, and share with others.

# New, Faster Library Wi-Fi

The Library has a new Wi-Fi network, made possible through a grant from the Cooperation for Education Network Initiatives in California (CENIC). CENIC is a non-profit agency formed to

provide high-speed bandwidth services to California's schools and libraries at a reduced cost.

Starting **Wednesday**, **October 17**<sup>th</sup>, Library patrons will be able to connect to the new Library Wi-Fi network that will deliver a much faster and stable connection. From October 17<sup>th</sup> through October 30<sup>th</sup>, patrons will be able to connect to the City's network, *cmvwifi* and the new Library Wi-Fi, *cmvlib*. On October 31<sup>st</sup>, patrons won't be able to access *cmvwifi* in the Library and will only be able to connect to *cmvlib*.

### How do I connect?

Go to your device's wireless settings and select *cmvlib*, and then accept the Library's Terms of Use (automatically displays on your default browser). The Library's Wi-Fi is public, open, and unsecured. Here's an <u>article from the</u> <u>Federal Trade Commission</u> on how you can keep your information secure using public networks.

What are the benefits of the new wireless network?

- Faster Internet speeds than before.
- The Library's network, *cmvlib* is not shared with other City buildings. It is only available in the Library, unlike the City's wireless, *cmvwifi*.


