

- 1) A Matter of Husbands I performed a monologue from this play two years ago, and I'd love to put on the whole one-act. It's a comedic piece in which the two actresses and the director all have some really fun choices to explore. If I were able to direct this piece, I might want to marry it with a selection at the end from The Vagina Monologues or something similar. I think the contrast between the two (the first depicts two women's fight over a man, the second is about female sexuality and empowerment), could be really cool.
- 2) Trifles I don't have as clear a direction in which I'd like to take this play, but I've definitely either seen it performed or discussed it previously in class. I like both its underlying feminist message and how horrifying certain moments are. It'd be super fun to try to build the performance such that the audience is truly repulsed when they first understand how John Wright died. One potential direction could be to do with this oneact what I'm planning to do with A Matter of Husbands.
- 3) The Proposal I was just in a production of this one-act, and while I think it turned out really well, I'd be excited to work on it again and take it in a different direction. I think doing this would be a valuable learning opportunity. It's a solid piece, of course, given that it's Chekhov, and I think it could be really funny, especially if we're able to find a good arc and make it truly melodramatic in the right moments.
- 4) Long Day's Journey Into Night This would of course be condensed, but it would ideally be at least an hour. I know that's long compared to the one-acts we did last year, and I completely understand if it's not feasible. I thought I'd include this play in my list, however, because I fell in love with it after reading it in class. It's so hauntingly beautiful, and I think it would work really well in the space we're performing in (assuming it's the same as last year's). I would be jazzed to put in the longer time commitment necessary to make this spectacular (if we were able to do it).
