A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MOUNTAIN VIEW RECITING THE FACT AND DECLARING THE RESULTS OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020 FOR THE ELECTION OF FOUR MEMBERS TO THE CITY COUNCIL AND FOR BALLOT MEASURE C

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, to elect four members to the City Council and submit to the voters an ordinance relating to oversized vehicle parking on narrow streets (Measure C); and

WHEREAS, the Registrar of Voters of the County of Santa Clara canvassed the returns of the election and has certified the results to this City Council in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the California Elections Code (Exhibit A);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Mountain View:

1. That the total number of ballots cast in the City of Mountain View was 35,317, and that a full and correct copy of the statement of results of said election for four Council seats and for Measure C were canvassed and certified by the County Registrar of Voters, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

2. That, at said election, Margaret Abe-Koga, Sally J. Lieber, Lisa Matichak, and Pat Showalter received the highest number of votes for the four Council seats for full four-year terms and have been declared elected as Councilmembers:

3. That, at said election, a majority of the voters voting on Measure C – Ordinance No. 15.19 Relating to Oversized Vehicle Parking on Narrow Streets, voted in favor of the measure and that the measure shall be deemed adopted:

Measure C – Ordinance No. 15.19 Relating to Oversized Vehicle Parking on Narrow Streets

Shall City of Mountain View Ordinance 15.19, which prohibits parking of oversized vehicles (such as recreational vehicles, boats and large trucks) except wheelchair-accessible vans with a valid disabled placard and those exempted for short duration activities (such as loading and unloading, and emergency vehicles) on narrow streets 40 feet or less in width, be adopted?
