SUBJECT: Library Services Director's Report

LIBRARY SERVICES DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

CCTV PROJECT

The closed circuit TV system in the Library will be upgraded as part of a larger City project. The project will be led by the Police Department and IT, with new cameras being installed at the Library to provide additional security for the building. Cameras will be placed at entrances and exits, in the surface parking lot and garage, and one on the second floor main area.

TEEN AREA & NEW BOOK AREA SHELVING PROJECT

The Library is planning to use remaining funds from the 2018 remodel to spruce up the last untouched space in the building. The first floor new book area and teen zone will receive new carpeting along with reconfigured and expanded shelving for materials. The new adult books will be relocated upstairs, which will give the teen collection more space to grow. The updates will also eliminiate the spinning racks that held the teen paperback books and allow for seating in front of the windows facing the park.

STUDENT CONNECT CARD

The Library is working on finalizing an agreement with the Mountain View Los Altos High School District to provide all students with a Student Connect Card. The Student Connect Cards will grant the students access to all of the Library's virtual services. The agreement will further strengthen the connection between the Library and MVLA while also promoting lifelong learning and literacy.

FACILITIES UPDATE

The curbside in front of the Library's Franklin Street entrance has been changed from a 5-minute parking limit to a 12-minute parking limit. This increase will provide customers with more time to make a quick pick-up at the building.

VIRTUAL PROGRAMMING


Upcoming Programs




