#### 3. STUDY SESSION

# 3.1 Conduct Environmental Planning Commission Applicant Interviews

The purpose of this Study Session was to interview seven applicants for the upcoming vacancies on the Environmental Planning Commission.

Mayor Ramirez introduced the item.

There were no public speakers.

By consensus, the Council selected the following time allocation and questions to ask each applicant:

1 minute: What have you personally done to make a contribution to the Environmental Planning Commission, or, if you are not currently serving, what would you bring to the Environmental Planning Commission that is unique? 2 minutes: What are your thoughts on the City's existing plans like the general plan and precise plans?

2 minutes: How would you balance private property rights and community benefits, and how would you consider public comment from residents?

At 5:40 p.m., Councilmember Showalter arrived.

The Council interviewed seven applicants and discussed its recommendations for two members to fill four-year terms beginning January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2026.

On the first round of voting:

Councilmember Kamei voted for William Cranston and Jose Gutierrez
Councilmember Lieber voted for William Cranston and Silja Paymer
Councilmember Matichak voted for William Cranston and Paul Donahue
Councilmember Showalter voted for Paul Donahue and Silja Paymer
Vice Mayor Hicks voted for William Cranston and Silja Paymer
Mayor Ramirez voted for William Cranston and Jose Gutierrez

William Cranston received five votes.

The Council voted again between Jose Gutierrez and Silja Paymer.

On the second round of voting:

Councilmember Abe-Koga voted for Jose Gutierrez
Councilmember Kamei voted for Jose Gutierrez
Councilmember Lieber voted for Silja Paymer
Councilmember Matichak voted for Jose Gutierrez
Councilmember Showalter voted for Silja Paymer
Vice Mayor Hicks voted for Silja Paymer
Mayor Ramirez voted for Jose Gutierrez

Jose Gutierrez received four votes.

City Clerk Glaser stated a resolution reappointing William Cranston and Jose Gutierrez to the Environmental Planning Commission would be brought back to the Council on December 13.
