MOTION - MS - Cranston/ Dempsey - That the Environmental Planning Commission Recommend the City Council include in the Housing Element: Program 1.2, subsection b, to eliminate minimum parking requirements for residential development in transit-oriented areas.

The motion passed by the following vote:

MOTION - MS - Cranston/ Dempsey - That the Environmental Planning Commission Recommend the City Council include in the Housing Element: Program 1.1, subsection f to amend ordinance and/or precise plans to allow emergency shelters by-right consistent with AB 2339 and Program 1.3, subsection h, to review R2-zoned properties for density increases greater than R-1 zoned properties.

MOTION - MS - Cranston/ Hehmeyer - That the Environmental Planning Commission Recommend the City Council include in the Housing Element: Program 1.1, subsection g, sub-subsection b to rezone 1702 Miramonte, 777 Cuesta Drive, and 1949 Grant Road (up to a least 30 DU/ac) and Program 1.4, to allow affordable multifamily housing on religious and community assembly sites south of El Camino Real.

MOTION - MS - Nunez/ Clark - That the Environmental Planning Commission Considered the 2023-2031 Housing Element Update Environmental Impact Report (certified and adopted by Resolution No. 18755), and Recommended the City Council adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending the General Plan to Update the Housing Element of the General Plan for the Period of 2023-2031 in Substantial Compliance with State Housing Element Law (Exhibit 1 to the EPC Staff Report), and modify Program 3.2 as follows: - Modify the first objective to clarify that community ownership structures and Opportunity to Purchase Act (OPA) policies are included in the list of displacement prevention strategies; Move the Tenant Relocation Assistance Ordinance (TRAO) time frame to December 2024; Evaluate and move the time frame for studying updates to the Mobile Home Rent Stabilization Ordinance (MHRSO) earlier in the Sixth Cycle.
