Subject: Appeal of Heritage Tree Removal Permits - 151 Calderon Ave (Building Permit #25-9390)

Dear City Clerk's Office,

I am writing to formally appeal the approved Heritage Tree Removal Permit for eight heritage trees including 4 London Plane trees and 4 Camphor trees located at 151 Calderon Ave, which was approved in connection with Building Permit Application #25-9390. This appeal is submitted on behalf of concerned community members who believe the removal of these heritage trees would be a significant loss to our neighborhood and the broader community, including users of the Steven's Creek Trail and local residents of the Eaves Creekside apartment complex.

The London Plane Trees and Camphor Trees are healthy, mature specimens that contribute significantly to the surrounding canopy. Their removal would result in the immediate and permanent loss of a range of public benefits that would take decades to replicate. These benefits include, but are not limited to:

- Environmental Protection: The trees provide essential protection against air and noise
  pollution originating from the nearby highway 85. They act as a natural buffer, filtering
  particulate matter and ground-level ozone, which is vital for the health and well-being of
  residents and users of the public Steven's Creek Trail.
- Temperature Regulation: The trees provide a critical cooling effect, helping to regulate local temperatures and mitigate the urban heat island effect in a heavily developed area.
   This is a valuable asset, especially for community members who use this space for recreation and exercise.
- Ecosystem and Public Space: These heritage trees are an integral part of the Steven's
  Creek Trail ecosystem, providing a home for squirrels, birds, and insects. As a rare piece
  of community green space, it is frequently used by a wide variety of people, including
  children playing, families gathering, dog walkers, and elderly residents enjoying a stroll.
  The shade and greenery it provides for those commuting or recreating on the trail are
  invaluable.
- Community Use and Awareness: The green space surrounding these trees is a
  cherished gathering place, not just a vacant lot. Furthermore, the public notification
  signage was placed in a less-than-ideal location, and there was no broader community
  announcement, which severely limited the public's ability to be aware of and respond to
  this action in a timely manner.

While we understand and support the need for more housing, we believe this goal can be achieved without sacrificing irreplaceable community green spaces and mature heritage trees. Alternative locations exist for additional ADUs, such as unreserved parking lots or the

densification of other existing units, which would not require the destruction of this vital community asset.

The destruction of the healthy heritage trees, which provide such a broad range of environmental and community benefits, should be a last resort. We urge the City to reconsider this approval and find a solution that balances the need for new housing with the preservation of our existing community green space and valuable natural resources.

Thank you for your time and consideration of this important matter.












Camphor (removal notices are facing away from the street area):
