SUBJECT: Library Director's Report

SUMMER READING RECAP

The Library completed a hugely successful Summer Reading Program on July 31. A total of 6,701 people participated in our programs. We saw a significant increase in registrations, particularly with adults.

LIBRARY TOURS

On July 19, we gave a tour of the Library to a group of teen interns from the <u>Asian American</u> <u>Forward organization</u>. The interns were escorted by Assistant City Manager Arn Andrews and

Councilmember Margaret Abe-Koga. Library staff introduced the interns to the lobby area, Children's Room, and second floor collections and informed them of our programs and services.

We welcomed another group of teens for a Library tour on July 31, comprised of exchange students from Mountain View and our sister city in Iwata, Japan. The tour was arranged as part of the Mountain View Sister City (MVSC) City Day. Library staff highlighted the lobby area, Children's Room, Teen Zone, and second floor, including the History Center. The teens were particularly interested in the textbooks in the Teen Zone and the yearbook collection in the History Center.

TECHNOLOGY SHOWCASE

On July 20, the Library participated in the Eighth Annual Technology Showcase presented by the City and the Mountain View Chamber of Commerce. Library staff spoke with 221 community members about library programs and services, gave out prizes with a spin of the prize wheel, and issued 11 new library cards. Staff from the Youth and Bookmobile Division shared a paper robot craft for children to make on-site or to take home.







SCI-FI SEPTEMBER

Sci-Fi September is coming soon. Every year in September, the Library hosts a series of events celebrating science fiction, fantasy, and the real-life science that inspires the stories. Authors Peter V. Brett and Ann Leckie are confirmed for author talks, while harpist Aysha Gomez-Kureishi will perform music from popular science fiction and fantasy movies. Past Program Highlights

The Library hosted two highly attended concerts in July. Classical guitarist Bowen Zheng showcased a repertoire of classical music spanning the last hundred years, featuring a variety of composers from around the world. Harpist Aysha Gomez-Kureishi transported us to the virtual world of Hyrule with her beautiful renditions of iconic music from *The Legend of Zelda* video game series. Both programs were generously sponsored by the Friends of the Mountain View Library.



Kids and families explored physics, anatomy, astronomy, engineering, and other topics through a variety of engaging activities during our STEAM Friday programs. Aspiring scientists, engineers, and artists visited our workshop to ponder and experiment with the STEAM topic of the week.



The Library's second Drop Everything and Read program was held in Pioneer Park on Tuesday, July 18. Community members of all ages enjoyed reading, eating ice cream, and listening to classical music together. We received positive feedback from attendees both in person and on Facebook.





An audience of 324 people of all ages were enthralled by the Happy Birds show on July 26. The remarkable parrots showed off their unique skills such as mimicking, singing, riding scooters, playing games, and more. The participants learned about parrots and parrot rescues, and a few lucky kids were invited on stage to assist with tricks.





The Library came together with 130 residents to give the Summer Reading Program a send-off on July 31. We enjoyed ice cream and danced along to an electrifying performance by Palo Alto's School of Rock House Band.
