TITLE: 2026 City Council Meeting Schedule

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the 2026 City Council meeting schedule.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

As set forth in Mountain View City Code Section 2.1, City Council Regular Meetings are held on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month. The following schedule proposes minor modifications to the City Council's regular schedule to avoid observed holidays and provide for a summer recess and a winter recess. City Council Special Meetings have been included to accommodate the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays and to anticipate Environmental Planning Commission interviews and the Council appointees' annual review.

As long as at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body participates in person from a singular physical location clearly identified on the agenda, Councilmembers attending conferences that overlap with a Council meeting may avail themselves of the provisions of Government Code 54953 to attend the meeting using the "just cause" provision. Use of this provision is limited to five meetings per calendar year.

LEVINE ACT

California Government Code Section 84308 (also known as the Levine Act) prohibits city officials from participating in any proceeding involving a "license, permit, or other entitlement for use" if the official has received a campaign contribution exceeding \$500 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant within the last 12 months. The Levine Act is intended to prevent financial influence on decisions that affect specific, identifiable persons or participants.
