STAFF UPDATES

- Library Manager Laura Shea-Clark retired after working for the City for the past 17 years.

SUMMARY OF SCI-FI SEPTEMBER

Over 280 people celebrated Sci-Fi September with the Library by attending themed in-person and virtual events. Our most popular Sci-Fi September programs included a workshop where children designed their own planets with provided crafting supplies, a concert performed by harpist Aysha Gomez-Kureishi that featured selections from popular science fiction and fantasy works, a look back at computer history with Computer History Museum founder Len Shustek, and a vibrant discussion about the preservation of video games from Video Game History Foundation Director Frank Cifaldi.

SPANISH LANGUAGE CIVIC LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The Library welcomed 18 participants from the Spanish Language Civic Leadership Academy on October 12. They learned about the Library's relationship with City government and were encouraged to join the Board of Library Trustees and the Friends of the Mountain View Library. Staff informed them of youth and adult programs, services, and collections available both in-person and digitally. Participants enjoyed a tour, which included a behind-the-scenes look at the automatic returns machine inside the Customer Services area. The Library gave all

participants a free mug printed with the Spanish translation of the Library's mission as well as a bag of promotional material.





HALLOWEEN

Halloween treating for kids will take place in the Library during open hours on Tuesday, October 31, from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. All three service desks plus the Friends' Lobby Shop will have nonedible goodies for kids to pick up, including a coloring book, crayons, bookmark, pencil, glow bracelet, and more.

CELEBRATE MOUNTAIN VIEW HISTORY

The Library will celebrate the 121st anniversary of the City of Mountain View's incorporation on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 7</u>, with a special talk by local history book author Nick Perry. Perry will share highlights from his decades of research on the history of Mountain View using photos and stories that trace the City's constant growth and evolution throughout the decades. Perry has served on the Board of Directors of the Mountain View Historical Association since 2011 and has authored two books about the history of Mountain View.

OPIOID ADDICTION PREVENTION WORKSHOP

Santa Clara County Supervisor Joe Simitian, in partnership with the County of Santa Clara's Behavioral Health Services Department and the Mountain View Library, invites the community to a Narcan training workshop on Wednesday, November 8. This is an opportunity for the community to learn more about the opioid crisis and the dangers of fentanyl and other opioids. The workshop would also include training in the use of Naloxone (commonly known as Narcan), a life-saving medication used to reverse the effects of an opioid overdose. Participants will receive a free Narcan kit after the presentation while supplies last.

UNITED AGAINST HATE WEEK

The Library is planning three events in recognition of United Against Hate Week from November 12 to November 18, 2023. Teens will be invited to make friendship bracelets in the Teen Zone on Tuesday, November 14. A film screening of the documentaries *Not Your Model Minority* and *The Issue of Mr. O'Dell*, each of which promote antiracism and inclusivity, will take place on Saturday, November 18. There are also plans to host a Community Safety Workshop in collaboration with the Council on American-Islamic Relations during the week.

Additionally, staff will create United Against Hate booklists for both young and adult readers that will be showcased on the Library's homepage. United Against Hate book and media displays will be set up in the Teen Zone and on the second floor.
