# **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Amending the Senior Center Hot Water Systems and Community Education About Building Electrification Grant Agreements with Silicon Valley Clean Energy to Extend Project Completion Dates to December 31, 2025 and Authorizing the City Manager or Designee to Execute Ministerial or Administrative Amendments to the Agreements, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 1 to the Council report).

### **BACKGROUND**

The City Council accepted and appropriated funds from two grants from Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) on May 23, 2023 that included:

- \$497,000 to electrify the Senior Center's hot water system and stoves; and
- \$70,000 to engage and educate residents and community groups about building electrification initiatives and their benefits.

The grant agreements stipulate that projects must be completed by December 31, 2024.

Approving the attached resolution would amend the agreements to extend project completion dates to December 31, 2025.

#### **ANALYSIS**

# **Senior Center Electrification Project**

The Senior Center electrification project is under way with the design phase nearly complete. The gas water heating system will be replaced with electric heat pumps that use solar thermal energy to further reduce utility costs. Sixteen (16) gas cooking appliances will be replaced with

electric cooking appliances, such as induction stoves. Construction and installation of equipment and appliances are anticipated to be completed by December 31, 2025, which requires an amendment to the project completion date in the SVCE grant agreement.

### **Community Education and Engagement Project**

The community education and engagement project seeks to understand how Mountain View's diverse community values and understands building electrification. The desired outcome is to educate the community about building electrification while also learning how to refine the City's messages, services, and products in a way that resonates with a variety of community members. In particular, the engagement targets non-English speakers, youth, renters, and neighborhoods that have limited ability to participate in traditional engagement opportunities.

A short survey asking about building electrification was developed this year and has been distributed at neighborhood ice cream socials, National Night Out, the Day Worker Center of Mountain View's Open House, and the Technology Showcase. The surveys were translated into Spanish, Chinese, and Russian.

The next phase of the project includes engaging with community-based organizations that serve the targeted demographics listed above to educate their clients about building electrification and receive feedback about how it could benefit or impact their household. In addition, focus groups could be utilized to provide deeper education about building electrification and how it benefits members of the group. The results of the survey and focus groups will be shared with the Council Sustainability Committee once completed. The project is anticipated to be completed by December 31, 2025, which requires an amendment to the project completion date in the SVCE grant agreement.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

No matching funds are required for the Senior Center electrification grant, which results in \$497,000 in grant revenue for the project. For the community engagement grant, the City provided \$20,000 in matching funds that is currently budgeted in Sustainability Projects, Project 20-99, for a total project cost of \$90,000, resulting in \$70,000 in grant revenue for Sustainability Projects. The grants include reimbursement for some of staff's time to implement the projects.

## **LEVINE ACT**

California Government Code Section 84308 (also known as the Levine Act) prohibits city officials from participating in any proceeding involving a "license, permit, or other entitlement for use" if the official has received a campaign contribution exceeding \$250 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant in the proceeding within the last 12 months. A city official is

similarly prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a campaign contribution exceeding \$250 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant to any proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use for 12 months after a final decision is rendered in said proceeding.
