**TITLE:** **5-Year Update to the Urban Water Management Plan and Water Shortage Contingency Plan - Adoption**

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Adopting the 2025 Urban Water Management Plan, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 1 to the Council report).

Adopt a Resolution of the City Council of the City of Mountain View Adopting the Water Shortage Contingency Plan, to be read in title only, further reading waived (Attachment 2 to the Council report).

## **BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS**

The California Water Code requires urban water suppliers to prepare an Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP) and to update it every five years. The City of Mountain View's last UWMP was adopted in 2021. Adoption of the 2025 UWMP is due by July 1, 2026 in order to maintain eligibility for State water grant funding. A Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP) is also required by State law and has been included as a chapter in the UWMP.

The City prepared and circulated the draft 2025 UWMP and WSCP for public review and held a public hearing on May 26, 2026. No Council direction or public comments were received that required changes to the draft 2025 UWMP or WSCP. Staff will file the final 2025 UWMP and WSCP with the California Department of Water Resources within 30 days of adoption. A copy of the final 2025 UWMP and WSCP will be also made available to the public within 30 days of adoption.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no direct fiscal impact associated with adoption of the 2025 Urban Water Management Plan or the Water Shortage Contingency Plan. The recommended actions are required to comply with State law and maintain eligibility for certain State funding opportunities.

## **LEVINE ACT**

California Government Code Section 84308 (also known as the Levine Act) prohibits city officials from participating in any proceeding involving a “license, permit, or other entitlement for use” if the official has received a campaign contribution exceeding \$500 from a party, participant, or agent of a party or participant within the last 12 months. The Levine Act is intended to prevent financial influence on decisions that affect specific, identifiable persons or participants.
