SUBJECT: Library Director's Report

LUNAR NEW YEAR CELEBRATION

The Library's new Bookmobile was at the City's Lunar New Year Celebration on February 10. The Bookmobile was one of the first things attendees saw before walking into the Community Center, and people were excited to see the books, movies, and games available for borrowing. Library staff issued library cards, checked out materials to customers, and let attendees spin the prize wheel to win free swag. Staff issued 14 library cards, checked out 148 materials, and interacted with over 500 attendees.





FEEDBACK FROM AUTHOR TALK WITH JOHN SCALZI

The Library received several positive comments to the Author Talk with Hugo-award winning and bestselling author John Scalzi on January 16. Librarian Kyle Hval was the moderator for this program.
