The Library is excited to announce the launch of the Adult Learners Program: Achieving Life Goals through Reading. This learner-centric program aspires to help adult learners build their English reading and writing skills through free, confidential, one-on-one tutoring. Learners will devise their own goals and work alongside a volunteer tutor under the guidance of the <u>California Library Literacy Services (CLLS)-provided Roles and Goals framework.</u>
